"I have volunteered for Home of the Sparrow for 26 years. When asked what inspired me to volunteer, I can be brutally honest: boredom. I had just retired from a very stressful job and needed something to fill my days. I work in the clothing apparel section, as I have always been interested in fashion and women's clothing, so this area seemed ideal for me. Volunteering with Home of the Sparrow has impacted me personally by filling the void created by my retirement in time and providing an outlet for my love of fashion and clothing.

I stay motivated because I love what I do and feel I can contribute, even in a tiny way, to Home of the Sparrow's success and our community in general. Additionally, being widowed, the Cary Nest and its volunteers have provided me with emotional support and friendship over the years, which cannot be counted. A fun fact about me that not many people know is that I am a refugee. I was born in the former Sudetenland, ousted by Putin's ancestors in 1944. After six months in concentration and refugee camps, I landed in Wiesbaden, Germany. I attended high school in Wiesbaden, completed my first two years of college at the University of London, and graduated from the Sorbonne. I then received a partial scholarship to the University of Michigan, worked for GM traveling the world, married in Royal Oak, and then moved to Chicago for my husband's job, where I worked for Motorola for 26 years. I started at Home of the Sparrow in Cary, where I am still today, continuing to travel through Asia and Europe, and retired in 1998. My favorite hobby is reading and knitting American Girl doll clothes, which I sell at fairs, with all proceeds going to Home of the Sparrow. I am retired now, but my last job was with Motorola. The next place on my travel bucket list is Ireland."

DID YOU KNOW...

Home of the Sparrow has a Subsidized Apartment Program (SAP)



Most families entering the HOS Short-Term Transitional Shelter Program can transition directly into permanent housing within approximately 4.5 months. However, while ready for a more independent lifestyle, some families need additional time to build resources and skills before moving into community housing. The SAP program serves as a crucial bridge between shelter services and independent living.

Participants in SAP typically stay in one of the agency's three apartment units for up to a year, receiving the same services offered in the subsidized shelter program. During this time, clients work on paying off utility arrears and repairing their credit history to become eligible for signing a rental contract for housing. In August 2022, HOS expanded SAP, adding two units as part of an award from Advance McHenry County (McHenry County's American Rescue Plan Act (APRA) allocation). The additional units have six bedrooms and serve an extra 4-8 individuals. This unit doubles the current SAP capacity and enables HOS to offer increased access to this program for families with children, particularly larger families.
