DID YOU KNOW...

Home of the Sparrow has a Supported Employment Program (SEP)?

Home of the Sparrow's Supported Employment Program (SEP) improves financial independence for people experiencing homelessness. SEP focuses on providing employment opportunities and livable wages, which is crucial for improving overall family well-being and preventing homelessness recurrence. SEP supports clients aged 18 and above, enhancing their job readiness, skills, and job search efforts. Participants, including those in HOS's housing, Shelter, and outreach programs, receive personalized support whether they are employed and seeking advancement or preparing to enter the job market.

SEP's immediate impacts include refining resumes, practicing cover letters and interviews, and improving job search techniques. It addresses barriers like childcare, transportation, and health issues to facilitate employment. SEP assists clients with connections to certification, education, and other employment programs. It collaborates with local organizations like the McHenry County Workforce Development Network, McHenry County College, and employers/staffing agencies.
